IX. AUDIT REPORT – Brian J. Waldron, Audit Supervisor, and Frank B. Holman, III, President/Partner of Holman, Frenia, & Allison, P.C.

Mr. Sheiken: We have our annual Audit Report, I invite the gentleman to come up and present it to the public.

Mr. Frank Holman and Brian Waldron presented an overview of the 2014 Audit and District financial picture by highlighting several areas of the 200 plus page audit report.

- The District received a clean audit opinion.
- The District has a good net position with money put away for capital projects, emergency, and maintenance reserves. There is only one finding which is not material in amount.

XI. BARNEGAT BRAG – Coaches’ Council – John Germano, District Athletic Director

Mrs. Wood: The next portion of the agenda is devoted to the Barnegat Brag. We began this program last year in September, during the 13-14 school year. I have stated at every opportunity when we open the meeting to this portion I always thank the Board of Education for allowing me to bring the talents of our staff to the Board of Education and to the public, because quite often you don’t always get to see what happens behind the scenes or some of the things that have happened since September of last year. Mr. Germano has shared with me a lot of different things that have happened with athletics. He has been here to the Board meetings before, but I asked him specifically to come this evening and share a little bit about his Coaches Council. We are one of the only schools, if not the only school that I know of that is doing the coaches council and Mr. Germano is actually going to be recognized as the Athletic Directors Convention later this year for his efforts. I am really proud of his efforts with the Athletic Department, and he is doing our Barnegat Brag tonight. John the floor is yours.

Mr. Germano presented a PowerPoint Slide Show as an overview of the Barnegat High School Athletics. Within eleven years our Athletics Program has been built from the bottom up. The programs accomplish many great successes, some of which have never

been accomplished in the history of other schools. Accomplishments include the following:

Student Athletes and Coaches has been recognized on Local and national broadcasts including ESPN, MSG, Good Morning America, News 12, and PIX 11

The keys to our success are working together, sharing ideas, and supporting each other

Mr. Germano also discussed the Coaches Council and the Barnegat Triple Threat Athletes. The Coaches Council was created during the 2013-2014 school year to unit all programs and coaches, share ideas and support one another.

XII. SUPERINTENDENT'S MOTION/INFORMATION:

Mr. Sheiken: Mrs. Wood.

Mrs. Wood: I just wanted to recognize that as per statute that we are required to follow Linda Kropf was sworn in by Mrs. LaGuardia, our Business Administrator, on October 27th. I wanted to recognize Linda and welcome her to the Board of Education, so welcome Linda it is a pleasure to have you aboard.

Mrs. Kropf: Thank you

Mrs. Wood: I also have a couple of statements. First I wanted to say that on Thursday night Anthony Scotto, Director of Curriculum, and I hosted the first Community Learning Lab. It was learning at Lefty's last Thursday. We had approximately forty people who attended the session. We had a lot of really positive feedback from that. One of the things that we asked people to do was leave notecards about the other topics they would like to see addressed in the future. I think the biggest one is PARC so we are trying to put together a workshop, a Community Learning Lab, for parents to attend to get a little bit more information about PARC. We are looking at other community venues. I have not had confirmations back from local business, but we are reaching out to places that had extra room. The Barnegat Diner has another room that is up in the top, Serpico's has a little room, Sweet Jenny's, although they are a supporter of the District, is kind of all open. We are trying to work with local businesses because it does support our Five Year Strategic Plan that supports community partnerships which is goal number five on our Five Year Strategic Plan. I just wanted to say that I felt that the workshop on Thursday

was well attended. The presentation only took about a half hour, but the Q and A section was about two hours long and we answered every question that every parent asked, and I think that it was well received. We are also looking to implement parent academies, although they have not begun yet. That would be for elementary teachers to help elementary parents understand the changes in how to help your children with homework. We hear a lot of concern over how to support math homework at home for a second or third grader. These are the kind of things that we are trying to do to keep the community informed.

Lastly, the Barnegat Township School District adopts and implements many policies in its governance of the schools. Policy Number 2624 Grading System has not been violated, however after meeting with various stakeholder groups throughout the educational community as well as conducting further research I am making the following changes. The old grading policy will be in effect for marking periods two, three, and four for the 14-15 school year. Grades will not be recalculated for marking period one, however if a parent has a concern about a grade that their child received the teacher will recalculate the marking period one grade based on the old system of weights. The student will receive whichever grade is higher. This only impact BHS as the term course of study is only utilized when addressing High School Courses. The new weights which increase major assessments and minor assessments and decrease homework class participation will go into effect in September of the 15-16 school year. We will still be hosting a parent forum on December 1st 2014 at 6:30 p.m. at Barnegat High School so that we may collaborate and articulate together in preparing for the 15-16 school year. I am thankful that there are parents and community members who feel they can come forward and share their concerns on this topic. I feel that if we can work collaboratively as professionals with the best interests of students in mind all of our students will prevail. I thank those who have articulated candidly, honestly, and with decorum. Please note that the Barnegat School District will be moving towards a new standard of academic excellence, instructional rigor, and accountability for student's knowledge of content and mastery of skills. I stand behind the committee's revisions to grading as it applies to homework, class participation, major assessments, and minor assessments. Those decisions were based on research, data, and knowledge of differentiated assessments. The recommendations were also based on a practical application of educated professionals; our teachers. Our collective goal, which is reflected in the District Strategic Plan, Goal Number One, is to ensure all students achieve their highest potential. This means we should be preparing our students to be accepted to college, but also remain in attendance at a college or university and obtain at least a four year degree. In the event their plan is a career pathway rather than college then that they be prepared for the demands of the workforce. I don't have anything further; I just wanted to read the statement. I also sent notification out via School Messenger today; I also posted it on Facebook so that it could be properly memorialized for the people who had some concerns.

Board of Education

2. I will make decisions in terms of educational welfare of children and will seek to develop and maintain public schools that meet the individual needs of all children regardless of their ability, race, creed, sex or social standing.
3. I will confine my board action to policy making, planning, and appraisal, and I will help to frame policies and plans only after the board has consulted those who will be affected by them.
4. I will carry out my responsibility, not to administer the schools, but, together with my fellow board members, to see that they are well run.
5. I will recognize that authority rests with the board of education and will make no personal promises nor take any private action that may compromise the board.
6. I will refuse to surrender my independent judgment to special interest or partisan political groups or to use the schools for personal gain or for the gain of friends.
7. I will hold confidential all matters pertaining to the schools which, if disclosed, would needlessly injure individuals or the schools. In all other matters, I will provide accurate information and, in concert with my fellow board members, interpret to the staff the aspirations of the community for its school.
8. I will vote to appoint the best qualified personnel available after consideration of the recommendation of the chief administrative officer.
9. I will support and protect school personnel in proper performance of their duties.
10. I will refer all complaints to the chief administrative officer and will act on the complaints at public meetings only after failure of an administrative solution.
