**1. BRACKMAN JAZZ BAND FEATURED AT JAZZ FESTIVAL**

The staff member would be instructed to write a check for their child’s enrollment for the full amount of the fee, i.e., \$390 for SAT and \$278 for ACT.

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4. Motion to Recommend that the Board of Education Send a Letter of Congratulations to Those Selected for Recognition in the Governor's Teacher Recognition Program.

Barnegat teachers have recently been recognized for their outstanding work with students and will be submitted for the Governor's Teacher Recognition Program. The following names will be submitted to the State: Elizabeth Hults, ILA teacher at BHS; Barbara Gross, Math teacher at ROBMS; Valerie Griffin, Physical Education teacher at CSCS; Karen Beverley, 1<sup>st</sup> grade teacher at RLHS; and Theresa Foley, 1<sup>st</sup> grade teacher at LMDS. One certified support staff member and two non-certified support staff members were also recognized: Michele Cucinotta, Guidance at LMDS; Marion Humphries, Aide at LMDS and John Bilyk, Building and Grounds.

A 15-member recognition panel consisting of community members, teachers, parents, and administrators made the selections based on use/knowledge of effective techniques and methods, establishment of productive climate and rapport with students, development of feelings of self-worth or love of learning in students, use of creativity, innovation, and efficiency, ability to increase student achievement, ability to contribute to the quality of professional development, and ability to encourage community service.

Each year, the State presents its awards for the Governor's Teacher Award at a luncheon aboard the *River Lady*. The State is no longer subsidizing county teacher recognition programs. 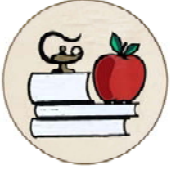
