#### IX. STUDENT REPRESENTATIVE

Mrs. Pilovsky: We have a student representative; he is Mr. Bengal (applause).

The district has initiated participation of students as student representatives at Board meetings to offer insight into district and student community highlights, activities and issues.

Please welcome our guest High School Representative: **Keith Lee**

Mr. Lee: Hello, my name is Keith Lee, I am the Executive President of Student Government here at Barnegat High School, and also the Student Representative for the Board of Education. To start off my speech on what is going on in the high school I would like to give a Class Wars update. For those of you who are not familiar with the idea of Class Wars it is a competition between classes. The initiative was to increase support for every (inaudible) at Barnegat High School, and also the attendance at certain events; at every event here that the high school hosts. Points are awarded accordingly to the class who has the most attendance at these events. In first we have the seniors, in second are the freshman, third we have the sophomores, and fourth we have the juniors. Moving on to recent events at the high school we have the Bee Positive Dance-a-Thon which was hosted by the NHS (National Honor Society), which took place on March 29<sup>th</sup>, 2014. The dance was to benefit childhood cancer research and to bring awareness to the amount of people in the world who are affected by cancer in their lives. We raised \$7263.00 at this event and all of that profit went towards the research for childhood cancer. We also had the Wizard of Oz, which was the musical put on by the Bengal Theater Company which was April 3<sup>rd</sup> through 5<sup>th</sup> 2014. It was the musical that the Barnegat High School Drama Department put on for the community. This show marked the best show in the high school's history making \$7256.00 from solely ticket sales. It was the most crowded show we have ever had. The recent show that was most profitable was Fiddler on the Roof which was performed in 2010 and made \$4300.00. Next we have the Junior Gift Auction and it was held here at the high school (pause in recording). Took in \$6800.00. We added to this cause by introducing VIB, Very Important Bengal Seating, for students and family members of the contestants; tickets were purchased prior to the show. VIP tickets also included Bengal Lease to Service where the contestant's escorts served members of the crowd. Each very important Bengal received a cold a beverage and something to eat; whether it is candy, chips, or a hot pretzel. We added another prize for our contestant's to win called Mr. Crowd Pleaser. This award went out to the contestant who had the most money in his bucket after intermission. Of course that

money, along with the Mr. Student Choice money, where the contestants went around during lunch and collected change from all the students here at the high school, that and the buckets that were filled with money for the Mr. Crowd Pleaser Award all went to the profit of the \$6,800.00. The audience was allowed to place the money in their favorite contestants bucket for him to win this award and the other two awards, Mr. Student's Choice, and Mr. Bengal. Our upcoming events include the Senior Trip which is May 2<sup>nd</sup> through the 5<sup>th</sup>. The Senior Gift Auction which is May 9<sup>th</sup> at Saint Mary of the Pines Parish Center in Manahawkin. The Junior Prom is May 17<sup>th</sup>. We are having our first annual Drama Club Showcase which will be May 23<sup>rd</sup>. Those who placed Superior at the NJ Thespian Festival (which I talked about last meeting, we took home 19 Superior Medals in State Recognition for students here at the high school in the Drama Department) will be performing their selected pieces for the public to see. There is a \$3.00 suggested donation and special awards will also be given out to some students at this event. It's also one of the last Class Wars opportunities this year. Scholarship Night, which Mrs. Wood talked about before, will be on May 29<sup>th</sup> and Senior Prom is May 31<sup>st</sup>. Coming to a close tomorrow the Executive Board of Student Government, along with the Freshman President and Vice President will be going to the middle school to talk to the 8<sup>th</sup> graders about Student Government. Their elections will be held in late May so that way the Freshman Officers can attend the Summer Student Government Meetings and get off to a strong start right in September. Elections for the high school will be held on May 23<sup>rd</sup> to elect our new Officers for the Executive Board and the senior, junior, and sophomore classes. The Class Wars Picnic, which was the incentive of the Class Wars will take place on June 13<sup>th</sup> for the winning class. Also on June 13<sup>th</sup> we will be having our first Senior Year Book Breakfast. Normally there is just a Senior Sign, but I thought maybe as an end of year event for the seniors, one of the last times we will all be together, we could have a breakfast and sign year books as an event to get together at the end of the year. Also, our Powder-Puff Game which used to be in the fall, but we moved to the spring for nicer weather and a better turnout. Lastly to conclude, I would like to sincerely thank the Board of Education, Superintendent Ms. Karen Wood, and especially our Director of Curriculum Mr. Anthony Scotto on behalf of myself and all of the AP Students at Barnegat High School for paying for AP examinations. I know personally as a student taking three AP courses this year that the price for all three exams combined would be a struggle, especially with all of the other expenses of senior year. Your decision to pay for these exams is greatly appreciated by each and every one of us. This has helped so many students in the way that now they will be able to take the exam for each course that they took this year. Thank you very much for this. Thank you (applause)

**RESOLUTION 2014-216**

**RESOLUTION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF BARNEGAT, COUNTY OF OCEAN,  
STATE OF NEW JERSEY RECOGNIZING THE MONTH OF APRIL AS  
"NATIONAL ALCOHOL AWARENESS MONTH"**

**WHEREAS**, alcohol is a primary factor in the four leading causes of death for young person's ages 10-21; and

**WHEREAS**, THE MONTH OF April will be filled with local, state, and national events aimed at educating people about the treatment and prevention of alcoholism in schools, colleges, churches and countless other community organizations; and

**WHEREAS**, alcohol use by young people is extremely dangerous, both to themselves and to society, and is directly associated with traffic fatalities, violence, suicide, educational failure, alcohol overdose, unsafe sex and other problem behaviors. Annually, over 6,500 people under the age of 21 die from alcohol-related accidents and thousands more are injured; and

**WHEREAS**, additionally, 7,000 kids in the United States under the age of 18 take their first drink and those who begin drinking before age 15 are four times higher to develop alcoholism than those who begin after the age of 21; and

**WHEREAS**, more than 1,700 college students in the U.S. are killed each year-about 4.65 a day-as a result of alcohol-related injuries; and

**WHEREAS**, 25% of U.S. children are exposed to alcohol-use disorders in their family; and

**WHEREAS**, underage alcohol use costs the nation an estimated \$62 billion annually.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Township of Barnegat joins the Ocean County Board of Health in proclaiming April 2014 as "National Alcohol Awareness Month" to increase awareness of the dangers and issues associated with alcohol abuse.

Of course it’s very exciting that Ms. Rogers was announced this evening for some additional monies to fund her program. I know that the Ed Foundation is actually planning on expanding their donations as they move forward. Sometimes at the beginning of the year you don’t know how much money they’re going to earn for the Foundation. It is just like a PTA, which really deals with fundraising efforts in order to be able to support programs. They also fund lots and lots of scholarships for our high school seniors and this year have actually started to fund some teacher grant programs so we are really excited about that.

Mrs. Pilovsky and Mr. Sheiken have joined me again up here. We would like to recognize some of our retirees. As you know we get down to the time of year when a lot of our folks have decided to hang up their hat and to see what it is like in retirement. The first person that we are going to recognize, if she would come forward, is Arlene Kadlubowski, she has been a Library Media Specialist. (Applause) Arlene has been at the Horbelt School for eighteen years. She has been with us for eighteen years, so congratulations on your retirement. I don't believe our next recipient is here although I'm not sure, but I'm going to acknowledge her anyway. The next person, she is in our custodial/maintenance department, and she has been with us since 1996; she is retiring this year. Her late husband was employed by the Barnegat Board of Education as well, but unfortunately he is no longer with us. We would like to recognize for her retirement Rosa Lopez. (Applause) The next teacher is someone that I know many of you in here have a personal connection to. Although she has been here in the district since 1986 she actually had a long teaching career before that. I believe her total years in education are somewhere around forty. I could be wrong; she will correct me when she gets up here. Congratulations to our next retiree, she teaches at the Donahue School, and that is Susan Sellarole. (Applause) She confirmed it, forty years in education, amazing! (Applause)

Mrs. Pilovsky: I just wanted to let her know that I have not told my daughter, my nineteen year old, that she is retiring because I know what's going to happen if I do tell her that.

Mrs. Wood: Our next recipient has been a teacher with us since 1977; she has been here for quite some time as well. We are so excited to recognize our next retiree and that is Donna Abbato. (Applause) Donna currently teaches at the Horbelt School, and I guess might be counting down her last days. She has thirty seven years in education. Congratulations. (Applause)

Mrs. Pilovsky: I do have to say one thing. Mrs. Abbato was my twenty four year olds Kindergarten teacher. I told her today that she will be retiring and she told me do not accept her letter of resignation. She said that you have got to wait until she has children. Once you finished taking care of her children in Kindergarten; when the child goes to first grade, then you can retire. (Laughter)

Mrs. Wood: Certainly last but not least of our recognition this evening. We are really excited that the next person currently teaches at the Dunfee School and has been with us since 1982. He is a real fixture over there at the Lillian M. Dunfee School, and is going to be sorely missed; that is Mr. Charles Laney. (Applause) Mr. Laney has been teaching for thirty two years, congratulations. On behalf of the Barnegat Board of Education and the District we would certainly thank to recognize and thank our retirees for their many, many years of dedicated service to the District. Thank you and congratulations. (Applause)

Your anticipated courtesy to the member of the public and the Board is appreciated.

Mrs. Pilovsky: Do I have a motion to go into Executive Session? Remove that motion. Do I have a motion to open up to Public Session?

Mr. Cloke: So moved

Mr. Quiroz IV: Second

Mrs. LaGuardia: All in favor?

All: Aye

Mrs. LaGuardia: Any opposed?

None

Mrs. Pilovsky: Does anyone want to speak?

Mr. Checchia: Phil Checchia, 12 Windward Drive, Barnegat. First I wanted to, with all this talk about Common Core, I like to ask this Board, because you know Common Core, what it's doing is its taking substance away from teaching and making the teachers teach how to pass a test. We need a forum, to the right, to the left, and down the middle of everyone that has anything to do with Common Core outside of this District. In other words there is two companies that designed it. Who is going to fund it down the road after it ends? Why are you taking away; Indiana just cancelled it. I am asking you to start and have a forum on Common Core and the future of what it's doing to the faculties of many, many schools. I don't want to hear it's mandated; Indiana just threw them out, Texas took something else. I am asking you to do it, vote on it, and do whatever you have to do. Make this auditorium available, you will have press. You will have the intellects on this subject educating you about Common Core; whether it be the right, the left, or down the middle. We are going to lose teachers because of Common Core.



I read in the paper that there was three Committeemen that attended your meeting, I think last meeting, in reference to the school on Route 9. Three of them went into the meeting; that made it a quorum. In that meeting they discussed an inference of an in proprietary and the in propriety itself. You know as an attorney, Mr. Montenegro, the inference of an in proprietary is worse, because that means you got away with it. Now, did those two people; you're a licensed real estate person due to the fact that you're an attorney. Those two people that remained in that meeting are licensed real estate sellers. Did they tell you that they were real estate sellers on the record, because I think you passed the minutes of that meeting tonight? I want to make those minutes public; discussion, who spoke at the meeting and what did they speak about. This is because I want to have a meeting with the developer who wants to talk to you about that, and I want that meeting to take place that quick. Remember two years ago what they did to you, remember the budget fiasco? You opened up a can of worms, because they have a developer. No Committeeman who has a licensed real estate who doesn't tell you that he is a Real Estate Agent is in violation of the state law, and I think you can attest to that. I discussed real estate with you, and I am licensed, I have to you I am a licensed Real Estate Agent. You opened up a can of worms because now you have some developers outside of this town who want to come into this town with expensive elections around the corner. Whether it be the midterm or not, money talks in Barnegat anymore; make it public. They broke a law the second time, they did it to you twice. They took advantage of you, and how did they get that meeting? Three of them had to discuss that meeting prior to asking you for that meeting. The Administrator always puts himself into something that he requested it. He is the one that told you that you had more money in your budget, in surplus, than you had; that didn't know the law stating you couldn't use the money that you received after the budget was passed and you had to put it in escrow the following year. That is the money they were talking about. Now you have the same two, two Councilman, three, attend the meeting to discuss it. That is like lowest learner opening up her statement and then claiming the fifth. You know that's a crock. That is what they did to you. The jeopardized the integrity of this Board for a real estate sale down the road that they are licensed to sell. Whether it be by word of mouth and coming back in commissions etc. etc.. It better be on record every word that they said in that meeting including them telling you that they are licensed Real Estate Agents. Now how can you separate an elected official from a licensed Real Estate person when you're looking to develop the property?

Common Core, pass it. Make this auditorium available because it's going to come back to bite you; you have no funding after it ends. Every teacher in this room, remember that thing I said about you taking a Drama Course, that's what teachers do. They teach their own personality with the subject you have to do. In teaching the substance you pass the testing, not Vice Versa. So I am asking you tonight bring a forum into this town. If you have to pass it, discuss it, do what you have to do. Please do it. You put yourself into a jam again with that Board over there.

Mrs. Pilovsky: You mean the Township?

Mr. Checchia: The Township. They came in here that quickly and asked you for a meeting and there was three of them; then they deny it. Well you know something, if that be the case and they discuss that behind closed doors they violated that Sunshine Act again. It will be taken out of this county because of conflict. I am going to end it there.

The Common Core you have to open up a forum and do it and do it quickly. We have too many people doing too many jobs that are not being paid to do that job. Again, watch your tenure and watch what you hire.

Mrs. Pilovsky: Thank you so much.

Mr. Sarno: Can I comment on that Mrs. Pilovsky please?

Mrs. Pilovsky: Absolutely.

Mr. Sarno: Mr. Checchia I am not sure if anyone else wants to comment. I was at the Board Meeting last month where the three Committeemen came to the meeting, sat in the audience. I was not aware; I don't know what other Board Members might have been aware. They were invited into our Executive Session by our President. I was not aware it was being done and many others did not. They walked in. Our Board Attorney, we discussed it, if it was proper for three of them to be in there before any discussion began. It was determined that it was not proper for three of them to be in there. One of them walked out before any discussion began. What they talked about before they got to our meeting I could not tell you.

Mr. Checchia: No, No, No, but Mr. Sarno, them going into the meeting should have never taken place.

Mr. Sarno: For showing up at the meeting?

Board Member: We didn't ask them...

Mr. Checchia: The three of them behind closed doors together. That's a violation. They discussed...

Board Member: The three of them did not discuss.....

Mr. Checchia: It's not Mr. Montenegro's position to give the Township quorum legal advice.

Board Member: Correct.

Mr. Checchia: So that went on record, and when you have your attorney doing it you should have threw them out of the meeting in the first place.

Mr. Sarno: They were invited into the .....

Mr. Checchia: They were invited for what reason?

Mr. Sarno: I could not tell you.

Mr. Checchia: A quorum was invited, let me just put that on record Mr. Sarno, your right. One was invited to that meeting. For the good attorney you had told you that you can't do it.

Mr. Sarno: Correct.

Mr. Checchia: That is not his duty.

Mr. Sarno: I agree with you

Mr. Checchia: That should have never taken place. I think you should have Executive Hearings on the person who allowed that to happen, because that's a no no.

Mr. Sarno: I agree with you, the three of them should have never been invited in.

Mrs. Pilovsky: Ok, lets....

Mr. Checchia: You know something you're going to have to testify. If this works out the way I think it does when I hear all of this it will be filed out of the county. You will have to hire attorneys to back whatever you have, and it's going to cost this District money for them violating it again.

Mrs. Pilovsky: OK, Mr. Checchia lets make this very clear. Mr. Sheiken would like to speak to you for a second.

Mr. Sheiken: I want to clarify exactly what happened for the public so that they really understand.

Mrs. Pilovsky: Just one second, give him a second to speak Mr. Phil.

Mr. Sheiken: I have not said anything yet.

Speaker: Let him speak first.

Mrs. Pilovsky: It's on the minutes Mr. Checchia, let him speak.

Mr. Sheiken: Those are Executive Minutes number one. Let me bring everybody up to date on how things work with the Board of Education. Please give me the courtesy; I am trying to answer you. We operate by Committee, different Committees we have,

Governance, Education, Negotiations etc. One of the Committees is called Shared Service, which is the Committee. We get some members of the Board of Ed meet with members of the Township Committee, the Mayor and Deputy Mayor.

Speaker (inaudible)

Mrs. Pilovsky: Let him explain. Phil

Mr. Sheiken: Phil you had your turn, this is my five minutes of fame. Anyway, so we had a meeting several months ago. We wanted to discuss what the project was in terms of the Edwards School. At that point they said we have a draft plan, but we are not ready to share it with you yet. So we said next month bring us your proposal and we will be glad to discuss it with you. The day of the meeting in March, the next day we were scheduled to have a Shared Service meeting, the day after the public meeting to discuss the Edwards School. The day of the public meeting our District Administrator got an e-mail from Dave Breeden, the Township Administrator.

Speaker (inaudible)

Mr. Sheiken: You have got to let me finish please, thank you. Anyway, we got a letter which would actually add to this point if you would listen to me. We got a letter stating that there was no reason to have a Shared Service Committee meeting the day after the public meeting since the Mayor was coming to the public meeting with intentions of discussing the Edwards School. As soon as they walked into that meeting with two other Board Members they were in violation of the Sunshine Law. They came with the intention of discussing.

Mrs. Pilovsky: Mr. Checchia, he is trying to tell you exactly what happened so this way you know it, give him a second please.

Speaker (inaudible)

Board Member: Just let him leave.

Mrs. Pilovsky: Ok, no problem, thank you.

Mr. Sheiken: We are almost there. Anyway to make a long story short, it was the Mayors intention to bypass, and lack of respect of this Board, and the integrity of this Board, to discuss the matter with the entire Board rather than discussing it through the Committee process. Our President, in her wisdom, decided to take it out of the public viewing and try to close it off before it became an issue for the town. We want to work with the Township, but we have to work from a position where you trust somebody, and you know their word means something. For that Mayor, for our Mayor to sit there and say that she did not intend to discuss an issue, but merely to introduce herself to the Board is just totally false. Thank you

Mrs. Pilovsky: Anyone else? Is that Mr. Aviles?

Speaker: Yes

Mrs. Pilovsky: Please step up.

Mr. Aviles: Hello. My name is Mr. Aviles, I teach English here at Barnegat High School, but I also work with a great group of kids on something called Bengal Buzz. Ms. Wood reached out to me. She said “Hey, do you think you and your team can put something together for the Board Presentation about the budget?” I got my team together and we put together what you saw today. I also asked her though, she asked me would you like to recognize the girls, I said only if I could speak about them. I have had the privilege of doing a lot of amazing things since I started working in Barnegat, and this is by far been the best thing I have ever done in my teaching career. I would like to tell you a little bit about it. Last year a girl who I did not know very well, Olivia Hogan, came up to me. She said “I have this idea for making video announcements”. I thought it was a really cool idea. We sat down, we started to talk about it, one conversation turned into many. We talked about some of the difficulties that we might have, we don’t have a studio, we don’t have equipment, and it’s not really a class. We kind of threw together, well what would this look like, how can we overcome these obstacles? We did it. What you guys see today is the hard work of a lot of kids that I have had the privilege of working with this year. What is extra cool about this it’s a hundred percent do-it-yourself project. It cost the Board, it cost the School District, absolutely nothing. I do it on my Prep. These girls volunteer their time, before and after, and during school, and you can see. I saw a slide up there not to long ago, and it talked about pride, it talked about collaboration, it talked about all the things we were hoping to accomplish. I can tell you since I started working in Barnegat this program, Bengal Buzz, has made the biggest difference, more than I have ever imagined. The culture and the climate of the school has changed into something so positive; attendance at events is up and just this idea that this was all student led. I’m not in charge of this, they make the decisions they decide what goes on, they do the editing, and they do the filming. I kind of oversee and make sure we have a product every Wednesday. I just wanted to say, I know Olivia is here, and I know Deja is, it has been one of the finest privileges I have had as a teacher to take on the Bengal Buzz; it has been absolutely amazing. I know Olivia asked me, she would also like to say something about how important this is to her. If you have not heard, she is going to be attending Penn State and what she does on Bengal Buzz she is going to turn into her career. I just think that is the coolest thing ever. Olivia I know wanted to say a few words. (Applause)

Ms. Hogan: Hi everyone, I am Olivia Hogan, I’m the host of Bengal Buzz. I am so happy to have been able to create this program. I went to the Guidance Department, Mr. Aviles, Mrs. Croft, and Ms. Thomson last year with the idea and it wouldn’t have been without their help, and your help, that this program could have been created. When I decided to pursue Broadcast Journalism in college, and as a career, I really wanted a way to get some experience before I got to college. I said “We don’t have a news cast at

school, but I think I can start one”. I am really happy to have been able to do that, and I think it has made a really positive impact on the school. I am really looking forward to see how it grows in the future. We are in the process of selecting some students who are going to take over the program next year, and I just can’t wait to see how it grows. Thank you everyone. (Applause)

Mr. Aviles: I know I see Deja back there. If Deja just wants to stand and say hello to everyone? (Applause) Deja, from the famous Antonio family, does a lot of the behind the scenes editing and they have just been an absolute pleasure to work with. Marie is actually getting her prom dress fitted right now so she could not be with us, but she is the other behind the scenes editor. Olivia mentioned that she is excited to see how it grows. We are actually in the middle of interviews right now, Olivia and I. We are sitting down and we are very excited to expand the program. It was funny, I mention before, it was not even really even a class. I went to Mr. Scotto and I said “you know, we would really like to make this happen”. Of course he was a hundred percent on board and just could not wait to see how it turned out along with Ms. Wood and everybody else. Mr. Nichol, who has probably been our biggest fan, always wants to be on Bengal Buzz. (Laughter) It is amazing the support that we have gotten for this. What we are hoping to do next year, like anything amazing, is we are hoping to expand it. I have a team of three now, and it looks like I am going to wind up with a team of eight or nine. It’s going to be a two year, a multi-year kind of deal; seniors teaching the juniors and then the juniors becoming seniors and continuing that cycle. Even myself, it has inspired me to make myself a better person with this stuff. I am pretty tech savy, but I have also applied to take some furthering education classes at OCC to continue to make what you guys see better. Next year what we are looking to do is we are looking to go to Wednesday and Friday. We are looking to add more people on the air and behind the scenes. I just wanted you guys to see, and I wanted the public to see just some of the great things we are doing here in Barnegat. Most importantly to me I wanted to make sure the girls I work with as part of this team know just how important and amazing this experience was for me. I know Olivia is very excited because I tell her all the time that she started a tradition. It’s very rare that somebody gets to start a tradition and this is something that I can see going for as long as Barnegat is around. I just wanted to make sure, I asked Ms. Wood, that I could give them the recognition that they deserve because I just think it is so special. I want to leave you with this. I sent down a survey not too long ago just to see how far the Bengal Buzz has gotten into the community and to the other schools. I got back about twelve hundred responses. Not just from kids in this school, not from teachers, but people in the community. I regularly get e-mails from community members I don’t even know, including some of the people over in the senior developments, who say I don’t even have a kid in the district, but they just can’t believe how awesome it is and that is how they stay up to date on the school. It’s cool to see how it’s bringing the community together. I just wanted to thank everybody for their participation and make sure that our team and the Bengal Buzz got the recognition they deserve so thank you very much. (Applause)

## **CODE OF ETHICS**

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### **Board of Education**

A school board member shall abide by the following Code of Ethics for School Board Members:

1. I will uphold and enforce all laws, state board rules and regulations of the State Board of Education, and court orders pertaining to schools. Desired changes shall be brought about only through legal and ethical procedures.
2. I will make decisions in terms of educational welfare of children and will seek to develop and maintain public schools that meet the individual needs of all children regardless of their ability, race, creed, sex or social standing.
3. I will confine my board action to policy making, planning, and appraisal, and I will help to frame policies and plans only after the board has consulted those who will be affected by them.
4. I will carry out my responsibility, not to administer the schools, but, together with my fellow board members, to see that they are well run.
5. I will recognize that authority rests with the board of education and will make no personal promises nor take any private action that may compromise the board.
6. I will refuse to surrender my independent judgment to special interest or partisan political groups or to use the schools for personal gain or for the gain of friends.
7. I will hold confidential all matters pertaining to the schools which, if disclosed, would needlessly injure individuals or the schools. In all other matters, I will provide accurate information and, in concert with my fellow board members, interpret to the staff the aspirations of the community for its school.
8. I will vote to appoint the best qualified personnel available after consideration of the recommendation of the chief administrative officer.
9. I will support and protect school personnel in proper performance of their duties.
10. I will refer all complaints to the chief administrative officer and will act on the complaints at public meetings only after failure of an administrative solution.
