1. GOVERNORS TEACHER AWARDS – PLAQUES PRESENTED PRIOR TO MEETING

The Governor's Teacher Recognition Program was developed in 1985 for the purpose of acknowledging teachers who exhibit outstanding performance. The premise of recognizing teachers is based on the following: (1) the success of our public schools are due to the quality and dedication of their teaching staff; (2) recognizing excellence will encourage teachers to strive for excellence; (3) by giving the teaching profession the stature and recognition it deserves, more capable people will be attracted to the profession; and (4) like other professions, outstanding performance should be acknowledged. Earlier this evening, this year's recipients were honored with plaques. They are: Sarah Fish, Randee Covine, John Belinski, Linda Schuler, Tracy Paslalides, Joseph Papernik, Sam Angona and Donna Durning.

2. ILA INSTRUCTOR WINS AWARD FROM BCC

The Center for Holocaust Studies at Brookdale Community College has chosen Jill Spain as a recipient of the 2006 Siegler Family Outstanding Lessons Awards. Ms. Spain is an ILA instructor at the Russell O. Brackman Middle School who won for her extensive and creative lesson plans on Holocaust Education. At a special awards ceremony last month, she was presented with a check for \$500; \$200 of which must be spent on classroom materials to assist in her lesson plans. The Board members would like to congratulate Ms. Spain on her commitment and perseverance towards a broader education.

3. LMDS CITED FAVORABLY IN STATE STUDY

The Business Coalition for Educational Excellence (BCEE) at the New Jersey Chapter of Commerce, National Center for Educational Accountability (NCEA), and The Broad Foundation are pleased to release NCEA's Executive Summary of the 2005 "Just for the Kids Best Practice Study" – which features the successful practices of NJ public elementary schools.

New Jersey was among 20 states to participate in the study, which measures whether or not a particular elementary school is successful in raising student achievement. It evaluates what each school is doing and how its practices could help other schools that are lacking in certain areas. The goal is to allow these schools to learn from one another.

We are pleased to announce that the Lillian M. Dunfee School was featured in this study as a “Higher Performing School” – meaning they set an example for others to follow. The Board is so proud of each and every person who had a hand in making this happen, and would like to invite the newly appointed Assistant Superintendent of Schools and former Dunfee School Principal, Dr. Joseph Donahue, forward to accept this certificate on their behalf. Great job!

4. MIDDLE SCHOOL STUDENTS, FACULTY, STAFF COME TO THE AID OF THOSE IN NEED

The annual “Kids Helping Kids” Coin Drive to benefit the children living at Dottie’s House ended successfully once again this year, collecting more than \$8,700 donated by Ocean County students. \$773 dollars of the total amount collected was done so by the students, faculty and staff of the Russell O. Brackman Middle School, earning them a Second Place prize in the category of schools having an enrollment of more than 700 students. As a “thank you” for their efforts, the school was awarded the opportunity to select \$250 worth of sporting goods equipment from the Sportime catalog. Dottie’s House is a Transitional Housing Program designed to aid survivors of domestic violence in their struggle to become self-sufficient and end the violence in their lives. We’d like to invite Brackman School Principal, Steve Nichol, forward to accept this certificate on behalf of all who contributed to this wonderful cause. We are proud of you all!

5. SCHOOL CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

As per the latest report from the School Construction Commission, construction is in full swing at the Russell O. Brackman Middle School!! For a few weeks towards the end of summer camps, busses were directed to drop off students at the Robert L. Horbelt and Cecil S. Collins schools so they could walk safely to the Brackman fields, while staying clear of all construction.

Once school begins, however, the front entrance at Brackman will be closed and the side entrance will be used as the main entryway into the building. Busses and parents can drop off and pick up students at Brackman, using the access road leading to the side entrance where additional security paid for by the State will be posted. The temporary teachers’ parking lot will be located on the Brackman property, closer to Collins School.

The article "School Expansion Work Underway" in the August edition of The Barnegat Leader only made reference to bussing schedule changes pertaining to summer camps. Again, these will not be in effect during the school year.

No construction is scheduled to begin at the Cecil S. Collins, Lillian M. Dunfee, Robert L. Horbelt or Barnegat High Schools until November – at the earliest.
