The Pre-School Expansion Plan is being submitted to the state upon board approval. The Education Committee reviewed several options and as a result of possible limited funds at the state level, the recommendation is to maintain Head Start in our 5-Year Plan to satisfy the mandate. Districts were developing pragmatic plans under the assumption that the mandate would be financially supported by the state. Therefore, it is in the best interest of the district to maintain a connection with Head Start, which would be accepted by the county and state. Within this plan Barnegat Township School District will use Head Start solely as their service provider for Years 1, 2 and 3 of the 5-Year mandate. The district will need to develop three (3) regular education classes for year 4 and 5 of the mandate.

In order to comply with the 5-Year Pre-School Expansion Program, Creative Curriculum must be purchased for the Preschool Disabled Program. The approximate cost of this program is \$35,000. This curriculum is consistent with the Head Start Program. It would be implemented in the Preschool Disabled Program and can be utilized in year 4 and 5 of our 5-Year Plan within our district.

### **CODE OF ETHICS**

### **Board of Education**

A school board member shall abide by the following Code of Ethics for School Board Members:

- 1. I will uphold and enforce all laws, state board rules and regulations of the State Board of Education, and court orders pertaining to schools. Desired changes shall be brought about only through legal and ethical procedures.
- 2. I will make decisions in terms of educational welfare of children and will seek to develop and maintain public schools that meet the individual needs of all children regardless of their ability, race, creed, sex or social standing.
- 3. I will confine my board action to policy making, planning, and appraisal, and I will help to frame policies and plans only after the board has consulted those who will be affected by them.
- 4. I will carry out my responsibility, not to administer the schools, but, together with my fellow board members, to see that they are will run.
- 5. I will recognize that authority rests with the board of education and will make no personal promises nor take any private action that may compromise the board.
- 6. I will refuse to surrender my independent judgment to special interest or partisan political groups or to use the schools for personal gain or for the gain of friends.
- 7. I will hold confidential all matters pertaining to the schools which, if disclosed, would needlessly injure individuals or the schools. In all other matters, I will provide accurate information and, in concert with my fellow board members, interpret to the staff the aspirations of the community for its school.
- 8. I will vote to appoint the best qualified personnel available after consideration of the recommendation of the chief administrative officer.
- 9. I will support and protect school personnel in proper performance of their duties.
- 10. I will refer all complaints to the chief administrative officer and will act on the complaints at public meetings only after failure of an administrative solution.
