DISTRICT HIGHLIGHTS – October 29, 2007 Meeting

1. ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS CELEBRATE WORLD PEACE DAY

Students from each elementary school celebrated World Peace Day on September 21, 2007. Each student planted his/her own "Pinwheel for Peace." This event was established by Cecil S. Collins teacher Sarah Flynn. She wanted to inspire these students not think of peace in association with war, violence or intolerance, but instead relating it to that quiet feeling of calm and serenity that is often felt as a child. Thus the Pinwheels for Peace Project began - using the pinwheel as a symbol to remind us all that peace should throw us back to that childlike sense of security and serenity.

2. MENTOR PROGRAM SEES RAPID GROWTH

The Brackman School is pleased to announce that 49 staff members are mentors to 162 students. The purpose of the mentoring program at the Russell O. Brackman Middle School is for faculty members to guide students throughout the school year. Mentors are there to offer support, empathy, and compassion for students. Our Mentoring Breakfast was held on Wednesday, October 10, 2007, in the cafeteria from 7:00 a.m. until 7:45 a.m. Breakfast was provided by Sub Busters and was partly sponsored by the Barnegat Municipal Alliance. Breakfast included: an assortment of muffins, bagels, donuts, crumb cake, fruit, and beverages.

BRACKMAN DANCE TEAM DAZZLES AT SUMMER CAMP

The Russell O. Brackman Middle School Blazers Dance Team was honored with four awards during the National Dance Alliance Summer Camp. The team won the Spirit Stick, the Superior Showmanship Certificate, the Silver Medal for their division and the highly coveted Overall Superior Showmanship award. 3. **STUDENTS ELECTED TO PARTICIPATE IN COLLEGE PROGRAM**

Barnegat High School students Austin Floyd, Rochelle Cassells and Jessica Philippe were elected to participate in Rowan University's "A Day in the Life of a College Student" program October 7-9. These students stayed overnight in the residence halls with a host student from Rowan, attended classes and participated in other extra-curricular activities offered by the University.

4. **D.A.T.E. PROGRAM RAISING AWARENESS**

In September, the Russell O. Brackman School was fortunate to present the D.A.T.E. program (Disability Awareness through Education). All sixth grade students benefit from this award winning program which gives them a better understanding of the hardships of people with disabilities. The program is held at the beginning of the school year to help students appreciate what their fellow students with disabilities experience on a daily basis. The presenters, who are disabled, share their experiences with the students in small group settings.

5. **STUDENTS RAISE OVER \$2,500 DURING WALKATHON FUNDRAISERS**

The Brackman PTA raised approximately \$1,600.00 in funds for student activities at the recent Walkathon. Students enjoyed walking around the baseball field on a beautiful day. The Robert L. Horbelt School PTA also walked their way to collecting over \$1,200.00 during their walkathon fundraiser.

6. **DEPT. OF HEALTH TEACHES STUDENTS ABOUT CLEANLINESS**

Third grade students at the Lillian M. Dunfee School recognized International Infection Prevention Week (October 14-20) by learning the proper way to wash their hands. Representatives from the Ocean County Health Department brought "magic" germs to demonstrate how germs are passed from person to person. Students checked their washed hands under the black-light to see that using soap and proper hand washing techniques do kill germs and keep us healthy. Third-graders also designed posters for National Hand Washing Awareness Week (December 2-8) that will be displayed at the Ocean County Health Department flu clinics.

1. **STAR AWARDS AND OUTSTANDING STUDENT AWARDS**

The success of the district is dependent upon a TEAM (Together Everyone Achieves More) effort- each and every staff member, parent, student and citizen contributes to our success and to the success of our students. In order to instill that team spirit in our students, we created the Superintendent's Star Award. It was designed to provide positive reinforcement for all students whose efforts reflect teamwork. Students who

contribute to the TEAM are recognized by their teachers and other staff members by having their names filled out on cards.

Each month, one student in grades Kindergarten – 5th is randomly selected from all the cards submitted in the district to receive a bike, donated by Causeway Ford in Manahawkin, NJ in conjunction with the Barnegat Hobby and Bike Shop.

Additionally, the Barnegat Board of Education would like to recognize one Barnegat High School student and one Russell O. Brackman Middle School student each month who exemplified teamwork by giving them each a gift certificate. We hope to create a spirit that will flow from the classroom to the school, to the district and to the community as a whole. These three students – Noelle DeSanti, C.J. Pacquing and Richard Dugan – have demonstrated excellence in their studies as well as goodwill toward others during the month of September 2007.

2. **BOYS & GIRLS STATE REPRESENTATIVES**

Each year, the local American Legion and American Legion Auxiliary choose two boys and two girls to represent them at Boys and Girls State respectively. Candidates that are selected after the rigorous selection process are invited to participate in a “Mock Government” in which the participants represent specific regions and political parties. The participants learned how to make diplomatic decisions regarding policies and hot-button issues. We’re proud to honor Stephanie Municchi and Jackie Ferrara, who participated in Girls State, and Alex Becker and Michael Pisano who participated in Boys State. Motion to approve the following amendment to the contract with Chartwells School Dining Services:

Management Fee – Chartwells shall charge the Local Education Agency a Management Fee of five and zero cents (\$.05) per meal served and meal equivalents for the 2007-2008 academic year.

Administrative Fee – Chartwells shall charge the Local Education Agency an Administrative Fee of five and zero cents (\$.05) per meal served for the 2007- 2008 academic year.

Computing Meals – Total meals are calculated by adding reimbursable meal pattern meals (breakfast, lunch and after-school snacks) served and meal equivalents. Cash receipts, including vending machine revenue, other than from Sales of National School Lunch Program, School Breakfast Program and After School Milk Program meals served to children, shall be divided by \$1.00 to arrive at an equivalent meal count. The per meal Management Fee and Administrative Fee in the amount of \$.10/meal will be multiplied by total meals.

Guaranteed Breakeven – Chartwells guarantees that the return to the LEA from the Food Service Program for the 2007-2008 school year will be at a Breakeven. In the event that the costs of operating the Food Service Program exceed total revenues (from all sources), Chartwells will be responsible for any losses (shortfalls) incurred but in no event shall the reimbursement obligation exceed the amount of Chartwells' Management Fee. The Guaranteed Breakeven is based on the following conditions and assumptions remaining in effect for the school year.

- (a) Reimbursement rates for NSLP and SBP meals will not be less than the rates estimated in Chartwells' proposal.
- (b) The value of government-donated commodities and/or cash in lieu thereof will not be less than the value of government-donated commodities and/or cash in lieu thereof estimated in Chartwells' proposal.



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- (c) The number of days meals are served during the school year will not be less than 170 days at the elementary level, 170 days at the middle school level and 170 days at the high school level.
- (d) The number of serving periods, locations, serving times and types of Service will not change materially.
- (e) The student enrollment for the Term of the Agreement will not be less than 3,200 students.
- (f) Certain variable District expenses must be identified and capped so as not to exceed current rates.
- (g) The actual costs charged to the Food Service budget by the District shall not exceed the projected operating expenses as set forth in Chartwells' proposal.
- (h) The selling prices of Menu Pattern Meals and a la carte selections will not be less than those included in the proposal.
- (i) Service will not be interrupted as a result of fire, work stoppage, bomb threats, strike or school closing.
- (j) The District and its representatives including but not limited to, school principals, teachers and District employees shall full cooperate with Chartwells in the implementation of the Food Service Program. The District shall fully cooperate with Chartwells to limit the expansion of competitive food sales in order to maximize the gross receipts and other non-cash sales of the food Service Program.

In the event the foregoing conditions are not met during the school year, the break-even obligation shall be reduced by an amount equivalent to any increased cost or loss of revenue attributable to the change in such conditions.

XIX. EDUCATION - INFORMATION

A. JOHNS HOPKINS CENTER FOR TALENTED YOUTH

The mission of the Center for Talented Youth at Johns Hopkins University has been to identify, nurture and develop academic talent among pre-collegiate students. Barnegat Township Schools has identified students based on County's criteria and has notified parents of the time and place for taking the test that will admit the students to summer programs on various college/university campuses. The students who voluntarily attend the sessions experience challenging and stimulating programs for students of high ability. The CTY program has been offered to parents for their children since the 1993 -94 school year. Many Barnegat students have received individual as well as state recognition. Parents have received letters concerning the program for this school year; the location, time and date of testing for this area were included.

B. STUDY ISLAND

Over 3,400 students district-wide have been signed on to Study Island – the web-based internet program that focuses on study skills and test taking strategies. This program expansion was approved at the August meeting.

C. PARENT CURRICULUM COUNCIL MEETINGS

Meetings have been scheduled for October 26, 2007, January 18, 2008 and April 8, 2008.

D. COLLEGE VISITATION

A quarterly visitation schedule is attached.

E. BHS LOCAL SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

An updated Scholarship list is attached.

F. BASIC SKILLS PROGRAM

To date, 347 students for ILA and 366 students for Math are receiving assistance at the elementary, middle and high school level.

G. DAYS OF DISCOVERY

Days of Discovery/Discovery Education is utilized through Mercer County Education Technology Center whereby science teachers will have the opportunity to use a thematic focus to build assignments, quizzes and writing prompts by using over 4,000



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videos and 40,000 video clips. This is a free service to the district utilizing digital storytelling to improve student learning and allow differentiated instruction and higher learning thinking skills to be acquired in classrooms. Virtual field trips become a teacher tool; the possibilities are endless. The purpose of this is to collaborate and connect to the global world using dynamic resources in technology.

H. CAREER RESOURCE CENTER

The Ocean County Consortium is doing away with Educational and Career Opportunity System (ECOS) effective January 1, 2008 and will be investigating a new Resource Center Program to service students in the college process.

I. ESL FALL EXIT REPORT

The ESL Fall Exit and Enrollment Tracking Report was submitted to the State Department before the due date.

J. VHS

One hundred (100) students are enrolled in VHS courses for the 2007-08 school year. There is a possibility of a few seats for the spring session. Students can sign up once we have further information in late November. Overall performance for students enrolled in the fall session appears to be a B-A average. Students seem to be enjoying the distance learning approach in all areas.

K. EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM FOR GIFTED YOUTH (EPGY)

One (1) student is currently in EPGY and performing well.

L. GRADE 7-8 STATE TESTING

The County Office received approval to designate April 29, 2008 for administration of 7-8 ASK testing. This change in testing was changed because the spring recess conflicted with the original testing dates.

M. DENTAL CLINIC

This year's dental clinic will be held on Thursday, November 1 and every Thursday after that until our students' exams are completed. It will again be held at the OCHD in Toms River since the Manahawkin location has been closed. Students will be notified every week of the students/schools for pick up.



N. TEENS TO BE HIGHLIGHTED

Carrie Sterrs discussed the proposal from the Asbury Park Press to highlight BHS for their special teen section in May, 2008. As part of this proposal, ten selected students will visit the Press and spend the day there.

O. TOY DRIVE

Barnegat Township Schools have partnered with the Toy Run Foundation in sponsoring a district-wide Toy Drive for the holiday season. A student organization from each school will be responsible for collecting the toys at their school, and, prior to December 14, the Toy Run Foundation will transport the toys collected to their warehouse where they will be sorted and displayed for area families and charities to “shop” from.

P. DISTRICT-WIDE DRESS DOWN DAYS

Barnegat Township Schools have instituted district-wide Dress Down Days. Each month, the district Communications office offers the employees an opportunity to contribute to a fund that benefits families within our district that have been stricken by a serious illness. The families that have been nominated will receive a portion of the money collected.

Q. KI PILLS

New KI Pills were distributed to all schools at the beginning of the school year. These pills will be given out on an as needed basis by each school nurse in the event of a crisis.

R. PARENTAL TRAINING AND SUPPORT

The Special Education Department will be offering **two** opportunities for parental training and support as follows:

The Barnegat Township School District receives a great deal of state aid to support its school programs. It attempts to follow the CEIFA school framework model in assigning nurses to a school complex. Currently, the staffing position exceeds the staffing model. The District assigns one full-time School Certified Nurse to each of its three elementary schools, one middle school and one high school. Due to medical needs, an additional full-time registered nurse has been assigned to one of the elementary schools (RLHS), one full-time registered nurse provides bus and lunch coverage, and another part-time registered nurse has been assigned to ride a bus and provide additional coverage in the schools during lunch breaks. The district’s certified nurses provide the required services, as per code, to both regular and special education students throughout the district. Their responsibilities also include the teaching of a portion of the Family Life Curriculum in the elementary schools, various in-service training throughout the district, and other duties related to their field. In addition, to ensure optimal coverage, two part-time LPN’s are on staff and act in a supportive role to the certified school nurse in the building which they are assigned. **The nursing assignments will be closely monitored throughout the school year to determine effectiveness and the demands of budgetary constraints.**

FURTHER, BE IT RESOLVED that the Barnegat Township Board of Education approve the distribution of funds for the 2007-2008 school year for the funded teachers/programs as per the attached budget summary from the NCLB Grant Application.

- 13. MOTION TO APPROVE UTILIZATION OF THE ENHANCEMENT TECHNOLOGY PROGRAM IN LAKEHURST, NJ AND THE CREATION OF AN ON-SITE VIRTUAL ALTERNATIVE PROGRAM AS POSSIBLE OPTIONS FOR DEALING WITH ALTERNATIVE EDUCATION NEEDS.

Motion to approve utilization of the Enhancement Technology Program in Lakehurst, NJ and the creation of an on-site Virtual Alternative Program as possible options for dealing with alternative education needs. Approval of this motion would provide the district with two possible options from MOESC (Monmouth-Ocean Educational Services Commission) for dealing with disruptive and disaffected students. Although the need for such options are not present currently, this motion provides the BOE with a pro-active approach should the need arise in the future.

In regard to the Enhancement Technology Program at Lakehurst, NJ, this program encompasses visual learning and credit recovery and is built upon the framework of the Virtual Learning Activity, a hands-on, technology

infused, problem solving curriculum. In addition, the program is serviced by a full-time Social Worker, and SAC to infuse a therapeutic, individual and group counseling based component. The staff versus the student ratio is maintained at relatively low levels to ensure a therapeutic and academic environment geared to the individual students' needs. The MOESC Board of Directors approved tuition rate for the 2007-08 school year for non-classified students is \$17,000.

The Virtual School-based alternative program that will be housed at EVES (Elizabeth V. Edwards) would allow for a minimum of on-site staff and provide a broad range of academic levels and components. The MOESC New Jersey Virtual School is aligned with the NJCC standards, and is fully staffed by New Jersey certified teachers highly qualified and more than one-hundred NJ School districts have used this program with over 5000 New Jersey students. This program could cooperatively engage an on-site counseling and therapeutic program to meet the students' needs.

14. MOTION TO APPROVE CHANGE IN THE MISSION STATEMENT

The Barnegat Schools, in partnership with our community, nurture and educate our children in accordance with all core curriculum content standards to prepare them for responsible citizenship and success in life.

CODE OF ETHICS
Board of Education

A school board member shall abide by the following Code of Ethics for School Board Members:

1. I will uphold and enforce all laws, state board rules and regulation of the State Board of Education, and court orders pertaining to schools. Desired changes shall be brought about only through legal and ethical procedures.
2. I will make decisions in terms of educational welfare of children and will seek to develop and maintain public schools that meet the individual needs of all children regardless of their ability, race, creed, sex or social standing.
3. I will confine my board action to policy making, planning, and appraisal, and I will help to frame policies and plans only after the board has consulted those who will be affected by them.
4. I will carry out my responsibility, not to administer the schools, but, together with my fellow board members, to see that they are will run.
5. I will recognize that authority rests with the board of education and will make no personal promises nor take any private action that may compromise the board.
6. I will refuse to surrender my independent judgment to special interest or partisan political groups or to use the schools for personal gain or for the gain of friends.
7. I will hold confidential all matters pertaining to the schools which, if disclosed, would needlessly injure individuals or the schools. In all other matters, I will provide accurate information and, in concert with my fellow board members, interpret to the staff the aspirations of the community for its school.
8. I will vote to appoint the best qualified personnel available after consideration of the recommendation of the chief administrative officer.
9. I will support and protect school personnel in proper performance of their duties.
10. I will refer all complaints to the chief administrative officer and will act on the complaints at public meetings only after failure of an administrative solution.
