5. **STUDENTS NAMED TOP PERFORMERS**

The Center for Talented Youth (CTY), founded by Johns Hopkins University, awarded top honors to five students of the Russell O. Brackman Middle School in their Talent Search. Sixth-graders Paige Hammeke and Madelyn Jackstadt both received a state award with high honors for their scores on the SCAT-Q examination. Seventh-graders Grant Bilker and Robert Taglang both earned scores of distinction for their performance on the SAT-I. Grant also received state high honors for his SAT score in Math as well. Eighth-grader Douglas Bailey also earned a score of distinction for his performance on the SAT-I.

6. **ELEMENTARY STUDENTS PERFORM WITH HONORS BAND**

The students performed the difficult material flawlessly, and we commend them on their hard work and talent.

7. **TED RAY NAMED TO STATE JAZZ ENSEMBLE**

Barnegat High School sophomore Ted Ray was accepted into the exclusive New Jersey All-State Jazz Ensemble this May. Ted was one of only three trombone players in the entire state to be selected for this elite ensemble. This is just another accolade to add to Ted's long list of musical accomplishments. 8. **BRACKMAN JAZZ BAND AND VOCAL ENSEMBLE ARE TOP-NOTCH**

Under the direction of Music Director, Frank Constantine, the Brackman Jazz Band gave another stellar performance at the "Music in the Parks" Festival at Lakewood High School, the Woodlake Country Club and Six Flags Great Adventure in Jackson. *RESOLVED, That the Barnegat Township board of education/trustees hereby designates Robert L. Horbelt Elementary School on 06/27/07 as the public hearing required by the Act.*

- D. SAT/ACT Prep classes will be offered as a high school elective, as well as through the evening Adult Education Program. Upon Board approval teachers will be trained to provide services.
- E. Program of Study – The first Barnegat High School Program of Studies was developed this school year by the District Supervisor of Curriculum and Instruction/Student Personnel Services Department. All current 8<sup>th</sup>-11<sup>th</sup> grade students are in receipt of their personal copy. Also, a copy has been provided to the Board of Education, BHS faculty, staff and administration.
- F. Summer Curriculum Work – During the months of July and August, selected staff will be revising the PSD-11 curriculum and developing the grade 12 curriculum as well. The cost (approximately \$12,000) has been included in the 2007-08 district budget. – see attached
- G. Parent Curriculum Advisory Committee – A Parent Curriculum Committee meeting was held the evening of May 31, 2007. Five parents attended. Input was provided regarding the following elementary school programs: BSIP, G&T, Chorus/Band, ILA, Math and Science and Differentiated Instruction.
- H. Young Authors' Conference was a huge success. Three authors provided whole-group instructional and informational sessions to students in grades PSD-8. Compliments to Mrs. Colleen Scrimenti, the district's ILA Supervisor for a job well done.
- I. All BHS junior students were provided a college application and letter writing workshop over a course of two (2) days. Ms. McKeon provided students with a step-by-step approach to gearing up for their senior year.
- J. As of June 18, 2007, approximately \$15,000 in scholarships has been solicited by our Guidance Department. The Board of Education will be apprised of additional scholarship opportunities at future meetings. College Scholarship Night has been scheduled for June 5, 2008. Scholarship donor letters have been sent out to over

- K. Barnegat High School participated in the Dare to Dream Student Leadership Conference at Burlington County College on May 14, 2007. High school junior, Marilyn Setola, was a student keynote presenter at the conference. The district was presented with a plaque from the New Jersey Department of Education Office of Special Education Programs for contributing to the success of the Dare to Dream 2007 Student Leadership Conference.
- L. High School Biology/Life Science and Algebra II state exams are going to be administered to all students required to take these classes.
- M. Annual Measurable Achievement Objectives (AMAO) for English Language Learning have met the AMAO standards for 2005-2006 through an appeal process.
- N. In June 2006, the Curriculum Department commenced the on-going textbook inventory process that ensures that all PSD-12<sup>th</sup> grade students have all appropriate textbooks and related materials.
- O. Over 300 letters have been sent to colleges and universities in order to put BHS on the map for next year's first graduating class. Over the course of the year, approximately 200 colleges and universities have been in touch with the Curriculum and Student Personnel Services Department to set up visitations for next year, and over 60 colleges and universities have already met with our junior student body.
